



Mission – Research

CRN-ACHDi Inagural Meeting

- CCHA invited to join the Canadian Research Network for Adult Congenital Heart Disease Interventions (CRN-ACHDi) as a pillar partner in 2019 - the first Canadian national ACHD research network to bring together researchers, patients and caregivers, providers and decision makers to improve patient care through collaborative, innovative and highly translational research
- October 16, 2022: CRN-ACHDi held its first network meeting
 - Included congenital investigators and research team members from across Canada
 - CCHA invited to speak about our organization and our ongoing activities. Also participated alongside other network members in discussion of future studies and network activities.



Beat Retreat Camp


- In person camp held September 2022 after 2 years of virtual camps




