A new website called ihartchange.org, created by the Peter Munk Cardiac Centre, enables patients, family and healthcare providers to log in and get information through videos, images and downloads. From information about transferring from pediatric to adult care, to coping skills and medical facts, the website also offers them the ability to learn about members of their Adult Congenital Heart Disease care team.
